SCOPE AND TASKS

Under the supervision of the Communications and Digital Managers, and in coordination with the team, the trainee will support the LREF's work on various topics and fields:

- Create content for social media (copy and visuals)
- Create content for the other Foundation's various channels (website, newsletters, publications etc.)
- Propose new initiatives to engage audience, drive traffic to digital channels and websites
- Create content (Adobe Suite)
- Create maps (QGIS)
- Create engaging videos, reels and inspiring content.
- Influencer outreach management (research, contacts, implementation, etc.)
- Design creative documents such as leaflets, brochures, presentations and proposals.
- Design new merchandising in line with our projects' values and identity.
- Copywriting, proofreading and translation content in the native language of the trainee.

Depending on the trainee's profile and competences, it will be possible to participate in other projects.
